The practical education encompasses stay in humanitarian organization. The student must enroll in all activities, maintaining diary for his activities.</p>
Organization	<p>Theoretic education: 25 classes</p> <p>Practical education: stay during full working hour (95 classes)</p>

Expected results	<p>Knowledge and understandings: The student will acquire knowledge and understandings for the most common health problems in dispensary and patronage conditions and will gain basic principles of health care in that domain.</p> <p>Key skills: The student will be able to apply in praxis the acquired theoretical knowledge.</p>

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Assessment	<p>Continual assessment (colloquium) It is necessary for the student to attend the theoretical and practical course to be eligible for continual assessment. The assessment is in written form (multiple choice questions). The student must report for colloquium, otherwise he cannot attain right for signature at the end of the semester. The student must acquire minimum points (60%) from both continual assessments when he is reporting for the final exam. In case of passing one of the colloquiums he reports for complete final exam. In case of failing both colloquiums, he doesn't have the right to take complete final exam.</p> <p>Final exam*: The student who passed both the colloquiums can take the final exam (practical). It is performed in exam period (June/July and/or August/September). It contains 2 tasks (skills) which the student must perform. Taking the practical exam is allowed only after the student finishes the praxis, gets a signature for the subject and acquires minimum points from both colloquiums. *The student must pick at random choice where he will take the practical exam.</p> <p>Complete final exam: The student takes complete final exam if he didn't acquire minimal points (60%) from one of the colloquiums. The exam represents combination from the colloquium which is not passed and practical exam. In case the student did not pass the failed colloquium, he does not have the right to take the practical exam, i.e. the exam must not be assessed.</p> <p>Forming the complete grade*: The grade for the whole exam is made based on the table of grades, based on summary of the points from all activities, including continual assessments and practical exam. The passed colloquiums as condition for taking the final exam are valid six consecutive examination sessions (no matter whether the student has approached to take the exam), after which the student attends the particular subject again.</p>												

	<p>*The subject coordinator (one of the four, by mutual agreement, for that school year) forms complete grade and writes it in the student's index after the student finishes all obligations for attaining the grade.</p> <p>Part-time studies: Forty percent of the planned theoretical classes and up to 40% of PRACTICAL are conducted. The practical classes are organized according to the agreement with the students.</p> <p>The exam is performed in EXAM SESSIONS and includes: Multiple choice test Practical test (it is performed after passing the exam, otherwise the same rules as the regular students apply). The grade for the whole exam is made based on the table of grades, based on summary of the points from all activities.</p>
