The student is required to regularly attend theoretical and practical teaching so he/she can approach continuous knowledge checks. Assessment of the overall exam is obtained according to the table estimates, based on the sum of points from all activities, including the continuous knowledge checks. The student is required to win a minimum score (60%) on the knowledge checks, otherwise he/she can approach taking the final exam.

**Final exam:** The test is in written form. It is consisted of the continuous knowledge checks in which the student has not won a minimum score.
